#### Assistant Principal Position

#### Principal Position

#### **Opportunity Class Placements**

Opportunity classes cater for academically gifted and talented students who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic and social level. These schools help gifted and talented students to learn by grouping them with other gifted and talented students, teaching them in specialised ways and providing educational materials at the appropriate level.

Applications for opportunity class placement are considered mainly on the combined results of the Opportunity Class Placement Test and school assessments. The Opportunity Class Placement Test will be held on Wednesday 31 July 2019.

If you would like to have your child considered for Year 5 opportunity class entry in 2020, you need to apply soon. You will need to apply on the internet using a valid email address (not the student's email address).

Detailed instructions on how to apply online will be available from Tuesday 30 April 2019 at https://education.nsw.gov.au/publicschools/selective-high-schools-andopportunity-classes/year-5 The application website opens on Tuesday 30 April 2019 and closes on Friday 17 May 2019.

**Excellent Work** 


The highlight of my week is often seeing the amazing work students are completing in classrooms.

#### Term Accounts

Term accounts will be sent out next week. Next term students in years 3-6 will be participating in the Sports in Schools Australia (SISA) program. This program will be used to provide students with expert instruction in both athletics and gymnastics skills. SISA provide not only highly qualified instructors but also highly engaging equipment. This year we have used the government Sporting Schools grant to reduce the cost of this program from \$45.00 to \$36.00 per student.

In the term accounts we have included an optional technology levy. Last term, almost \$1000 was raised from this levy. This allowed us to purchase multiple iPad charging stations. This has made the task of charging iPads much quicker and easier, ensuring students have access to fully charged technology each day.

#### ANZAC Day

As ANZAC day falls in the school holidays, we will be commemorating this event on Thursday 11<sup>th</sup> April with a whole school ANZAC assembly. It is Department of Education protocol to hold school ANZAC assemblies prior to 25<sup>th</sup> April. Teachers will be talking with students about the importance of ANZAC day, parents may also want to discuss this with their children prior to our assembly.

#### **Easter Celebrations at Excelsior**

Term 2 will end on Friday with our Easter celebrations. K-2 students will participate in a Easter Hat parade on Friday morning, this will be followed by the drawing of the Easter raffle and a morning tea for parents in the lower quad.

### School Holiday Safety

With the school holidays approaching, daily routines will soon change. Different play locations and holiday destinations means different traffic environments.

So to help keep our children safe, families are reminded about these key road safety points:

• Stop, look, listen, think every time you cross the road.

If your child is aged 8 years or younger hold their hand when walking near or across roads. If your child is 9-10 years old always actively supervise them.

- It's the law that everyone wears a helmet when riding a bike in a public place. It makes sense to wear a helmet when riding scooters and skateboards too!
- Click clack front 'n back every person for every trip. Everyone in the car must be securely

buckled up in the right seatbelt or child restraint.

• Talk to your child about being a safe road user.

Reinforce safe road behaviours by being a good role model! Children learn safe road behaviours from the adults who care for them. Talk about what you are doing to be safe when near roads, in the car and when riding.

 Point out road safety differences and dangers in new environments. This is especially important when on holidays in different surroundings. Roads, footpaths, parks, carparks, bike tracks and bike lanes may look different in holiday areas.

The best way to keep your child safe is to actively supervise them. Talk and teach your child about road safety every time you are out an about. Remind other adults who care for your children to do this too.

#### MindQuest and ThinkClub

A reminder that MindQuest 2019 is offering Gifted and Talented courses at Glenwood High School on Sat 1<sup>st</sup> June and Sunday 2<sup>nd</sup> June at Glenwood High School. A variety of courses for students in Years 1-6 are on offer at a cost of \$200 per person, per course. These courses are designed to challenge and extend students with similar interests and abilities.

Think Club also offer a variety of experiential workshops for the inquisitive, problem-solving, creative and capable child. These courses are located at Sydney Boys High and are available on Tuesday 16<sup>th</sup> and Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> April. Prices vary depending on the number of workshops attended, but they begin at a cost of \$110 per child for one workshop.

#### NAPLAN

NAPLAN assesses literacy and numeracy skills for all students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 each year across Australia. The NAPLAN tests cover reading, writing, language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. Students at Excelsior PS will be completing NAPLAN paper tests in 2019 on Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> May, Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> May and Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> May.
