Uniform



Student from 3R completed some wonderful research projects, including these two on Matthew Flinders.



ANZAC DAY

On April 25th, our School Captains and I attended the Castle Hill RSL ANZAC Day Dawn Service at the Centenary of ANZAC War Memorial. I would like to thank our Captains and their families for attending and showing their respect to our past and present service men and women.

NAPLAN

A reminder that we will be administering the NAPLAN assessments next week for students in Years 3 and 5. Year 3 students will be conducting the assessments in the Year 2 demountables so that they are away from the distractions of the build. If a student is absent for a test, we will endeavour to conduct catch up assessments throughout the week. All assessments must be completed by Friday 17th May.

Friendship Groups

Year 6 students participated in a training day for the Friendship Group program which helps to develop their leadership skills. All students in K-6 will participate in the Friendship Group program each Friday from weeks 3-10. Students are placed into groups across K-6 which are led by their Year 6 peers. This program fosters friendships and develops social skills.

Walk To School Safely Day

Walk To School Safely Day is a national event held on 17th May when all primary children are encouraged to walk and commute safely to school. This event is a timely reminder that students and parents are strongly urged to practice safety when commuting to and from school. Our streets are busy each morning and afternoon due to the extra cars associated with our build. I would therefore encourage everyone to have children enter and exit cars from the footpaths and not on the road. I would also recommend parking further down the street and walking to collect children, or use the Kiss and Drop Zone in accordance with the rules. There have been some unsafe practices observed on Elberta Ave, particularly at home time. Parents and students must use the pedestrian crossing when crossing the road and exercise extreme caution.

Backyard League

Next week students in Years 1-6 will participate in a Backyard League program which is organised by National Rugby League Development Officers. Each student will participate in a half hour lesson to introduce some skills to students whilst focussing on
