

We anticipate that the new office area will be operational from Monday 5th August.



Staff Development Day

On Monday 22nd July the staff of Excelsior PS participated in professional learning to support school plan. arranged for a We psychologist to provide staff with strategies for communication and positive giving and receiving feedback in preparation for our coteaching classrooms in 2020. We also engaged in a presentation from Ms Chevalier and Miss Willis on Aboriginal education and discussed our Learning Dispositions currently being introduced to students. This term, staff are engaging in intensive training to support their knowledge and understanding of teaching in Innovative Learning Environments. We are taking a very targeted approach to support staff and students in our future classrooms.

Investing in our schools

The NSW Government is investing \$6.7 billion over the next four years to deliver 190 new and upgraded schools to support communities across NSW. In addition, a record \$1.3 billion is being spent on school maintenance over five years. This is the largest investment in public education infrastructure in the history of NSW.

Excelsior Public School

An upgrade is underway for Excelsior Public School to deliver new facilities and innovative learning spaces. The project will deliver:

- 14 new innovative learning spaces
- a new three-storey building
- additional administration area
- a new library and new school entrance.

Progress summary

Construction of the new three-storey school building has progressed, with the concrete structure now complete. Roofing, cladding services and fitout have now commenced.

Administration Building G opens in Term 3

The new administration office is almost complete and will be ready for handover and use in Term 3.

The existing office building refurbishment has also commenced and includes:

- refurbishment of the offices to special programs rooms; and
- updates to the staff room.

These areas have been fenced and hoarded off from the school. Separate access areas have been established for construction workers.


This marks another milestone in the project and a step closer to delivering the school upgrade scheduled for completion in late 2020.

We are here to make sure that work is completed safely and efficiently. We continue to work with the Principal and staff to ensure that disruptions are minimised.

Frequently asked questions

The new administration block will be open in Term 3, will this change any access routes?

Yes. The completion of the new administration office also includes an upgrade to the site pedestrian entry on Rondelay Avenue.

What steps will be taken to control noise and dust impacts?

Hoarding and shade cloth have been installed to reduce noise and dust impacts on the school and our neighbours.

How will traffic be managed?

The Contractor will continue to manage the construction traffic with all deliveries being completed outside school opening and closing times.

How will you keep us informed during construction?

School infrastructure NSW will continue to share construction updates and project information as the project progresses. We will provide information through project updates, our website and school newsletters.
