From the Principal

Kindergarten Enrolments

We are currently taking enrolments for our Kindergarten classes for 2020. In order for us to organise staffing for 2020 and transition programs it is important for us to have accurate student numbers for our new kindergarten enrolments.

If you are planning to enrol a kindergarten child for next year, please come to the school office to complete the enrolment process by 27th September.

Please also see important information about changes to the Department of Education's enrolment policy below.

Changes to Enrolment Policy

The Department of Education has strengthened its enrolment policy regarding the enrolment of non-local students.

Currently Excelsior Public School only excepts non-local enrolments under exceptional circumstances or if as the siblings of already enrolled students. I envisage this will continue to be the case for 2020.

Changes to the policy include schools having an enrolment cap based on their permanent classrooms. This cap will affect the schools ability to enrol non-local students. At present Excelsior Public School has not been provided with its enrolment cap for 2020.

Parents enrolling children will now be asked to provide the 100 point residential address check to confirm they live within the schools designated intake area. Documents accepted for this check can be found at:
