Applications for Opportunity Classes 2021

Changes to the opportunity class placement process for 2020 Year 4 students

The 2021 Year 5 opportunity class placement process was put on hold in April 2020 due to the COVID-19 situation.

We now have a revised and simplified timeline for the OC placement process to ensure that students and families can have certainty about their placement as soon as possible.

The changes include:

• A new date for online applications. Parents must apply between 9 June 2020 and 26 June 2020. Late applications cannot be accepted.

A new test date - Wednesday September 2020.

To ensure fair and consistent assessment of students across New South Wales, students will be offered places based only on their test results this year – there will be no school assessment scores.

There will also be no opportunity for appeals given the tight timeframes.

Kiss and Drop

It is timely to remind parents of the Kiss and Drop rules.

Our Kiss and Drop rules apply from 8.00am-9.30am and from 2.00pm – 3.30pm.



Please see the pictures below for the specific rules and fines that apply for non-compliance. Rangers have been regularly present at the Kiss and Drop zone since students have returned to full time learning at school.

As we are currently implementing a staggered finish time parents may be finding the drive time to Kiss and Drop is less than usual. Please abide by the 2 minute only stop time within the Kiss and Drop Zone. Also remember that you need to allow time for your child to get from the classroom to Kiss and Drop.

If using the Kiss and Drop area and your child is not waiting at the designated area when you reach the top of the line, the maximum time you can wait is 2 minutes. After this time, you will be required to drive around the block and re-enter the queue.

Teachers are on duty to ensure student safety and not to manage parents who refuse to follow road rules. Millie in 5G has drawn a beautiful picture of a Kiss and Drop zone working perfectly. We will be erecting additional Kiss and Drop Rules posters as a reminder of the correct procedure.

SCHOOL ZONE Penalty from \$344 and 2 demerit points



NO PARKING

You can stop only to drop off or pick up passengers or goods and you must not stop for more than 2 minutes and The driver must stay within 3 metres of your vehicle. Stopping includes when the vehicle is not moving but the engine is still running.

SCHOOL ZONE Penalty from \$191 and 2 demerit points






Star Students
