#### <u>National Reconciliation Week 2021 – 27<sup>th</sup> May –</u> <u>3<sup>rd</sup> June</u>



2021 marks twenty years of Reconciliation Australia and almost three decades of Australia's formal reconciliation process.

Reconciliation Australia's theme for 2021, 'More than a word. Reconciliation takes action', urges the reconciliation movement towards braver and more impactful action.

Reconciliation is a journey for all Australians – as individuals, families, communities, organisations

and importantly as a nation. At the heart of this journey are relationships between the broader Australian community and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

At Excelsior Public School we're currently working on initiatives that support reconciliation and will share more about our actions as they happen. During National Reconciliation week, students will participate in classroom activities that support the reconciliation process.

The artwork used in the 2021 National Reconciliation poster is called 'Action' by Jessica Johnson. It is the story of the land and community sharing the united call for action on reconciliation.



Aboriginal and Torres Strait Island peoples have been listening to the heartbeat of the land and sea for generations. With their rainbow shaped souls, the spirits ask for us to join and make reconciliation more than a word, take action. We need to love one another and every aspect of the existing environment and community – we all have a role to play.


